ACT English

The ACT English section is designed to measure your skills in reading comprehension, grammar, and usage. The section consists of 75 questions that must be answered in 45 minutes. The questions are divided into three types:

ACT Reading

- Social Science: This passage is a work of social science, such as sociology, psychology, or economics.
- Natural Science: This passage is a work of natural science, such as biology, chemistry, or physics.

ACT Science

The ACT Science section is designed to measure your skills in scientific reasoning and problem-solving. The section consists of 40 questions that must be answered in 35 minutes. The questions are based on six different science passages:


- Biology: Two passages

There are a number of things you can do to prepare for the ACT English, Reading, and Science sections. Here are a few tips:


- Take practice tests. The best way to prepare for the ACT is to take practice tests. This will help you get familiar with the format and content of the test and identify areas where you need to improve.
